Allergy Alert

Christ the King CES is an “**allergen aware school**”. There are pupils in attendance who suffer from severe and life-threatening allergies to certain foods, such as peanut and nut products and, in some cases, dairy, seafood, and eggs. Exposure to the smallest quantities can cause severe life-threatening reactions. **We at Christ the King CES would appreciate the cooperation of the entire school community by NOT sending any lunches or snacks that could potentially harm a pupil or staff member. Please make sure that all of your children’s caregivers are aware of the food restrictions within their classroom. Students should be reminded not to share food items. No food treats are to be sent to the school for birthdays or special occasions.** There are many alternatives such as stickers and pencils. All food treats sent for sharing will be returned for home use.

May is Food Allergy Awareness Month

May is Food Allergy Awareness Month in Canada. Food allergy is one of the leading causes of potentially life-threatening anaphylactic reactions and a public health concern in Canada, especially among children. Over 3 million Canadians are affected by food allergy, that’s 7.5% of the population. The impact of food allergy is far greater, with an estimated 50% of households being either directly or indirectly affected by food allergy. That means 1-in-2 Canadian households are impacted by food allergy. As there is no way of predicting how severe an allergic reaction may be and no known cure for food allergy, avoiding the allergenic food is required to prevent a reaction.

Important Update on the DPCDSB Dress Code Policy

March 4, 2025

The Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board (DPCDSB) remains committed to fostering a safe, caring, and inclusive learning environment where all students feel a sense of belonging and can achieve success. Dress codes and school uniforms are designed to support diversity, accessibility, safety, and the dignity of all students.

On January 28, 2025, the Board of Trustees approved updates to **Policy P-2006 Dress Code and School Uniform**. As part of these changes, dress code expectations now require that students ensure the area from the top of the shoulders to mid-thigh is covered.

Additionally, the DPCDSB dress code continues to prohibit any clothing with messages that contain or depict offensive or inappropriate content. Students are not permitted to wear attire that promotes:

- Hate
- Discrimination
- Illegal activity
- Profanity
- Violence
- Political language
- Threats to health and safety
- Any content that violates the Ontario Human Rights Code

We appreciate your support in ensuring our schools remain welcoming and respectful spaces for all students.

Dear Christ The King Catholic Elementary School Families,

Peel Public Health will offer a free immunization clinic for Grade 7 and 8 students attending Christ The King Catholic Elementary School on **Friday, May 23, 2025**, starting at approximately 9:00 am until 11:30 am. **Please note:** the team may leave earlier if all eligible students have been seen. This will be the **last** clinic visit for the school year.

Vaccines offered:

- **Meningococcal ACYW-135** helps protect against inflammation of the lining of the brain caused by certain bacteria. **This one-dose vaccine is required to attend school in Ontario**, unless a valid exemption is provided.
- **Hepatitis B (Hep B)** helps protect against liver disease and cancer caused by the hepatitis B virus. Please check your child's vaccination record to see if they received some or all their Hepatitis B vaccinations (e.g. TWINRIX®).
- **Human Papillomavirus (HPV-9)** can prevent certain cancers later in life.

Please visit peelregion.ca/health/vaccinations/school-vaccination-program#consent to learn more about the vaccinations being offered.

These vaccines are all free for students. Some vaccines are publicly funded for a limited time, and the student may only be eligible until a certain age.

Immunization consent process:

- If you have **not** yet provided consent, visit **School vaccination program** at peelregion.ca/immunize to download, print, and complete the consent form. The completed consent form must be returned to the school with your child on or before the day of the clinic.
- When you provide consent for the Hep B or HPV-9 vaccines, you are providing consent for all the doses in each two-dose vaccine series, unless Peel Public Health is notified of a change in consent
- Once you provide consent (online, written, or verbal), your child may receive their immunization at any Region of Peel clinic, including school and community locations. For example, if your child gets their first dose at a community clinic, they may get their next dose at a school clinic without needing a new consent form, unless Peel Public Health is notified of a change in consent.

Don't know if your child has had these vaccines?

You can check immunization records online through the [Immunize Connect Ontario \(ICON\) website](http://immunizeconnectontario.ca). **If you have an immunization record (yellow card), please review it to see which vaccines your child requires, and have your child bring a copy of the record to school with them on the day of the clinic.** If you are still not sure what your child needs, consult their doctor or contact Peel Public Health at **905-799-7700** (toll-free: **1-888-919-7800**).

Ticks & Lyme Disease

How to prevent tick bites when outdoors



Blacklegged ticks that may carry Lyme disease live in wooded areas, tall grasses and bushes. Protect yourself:

- **Wear light-coloured clothing.** It makes ticks easier to spot.
- **Wear closed footwear** and socks and a long sleeve shirt tucked into long pants. Tuck your pants into your socks.
- **Use an insect repellent** containing DEET or icaridin on clothes and exposed skin. Always be sure to follow the manufacturer's directions on how to use it.
- **Check for ticks on your body**, paying special attention to the groin area, belly button, armpits, head and behind ears and knees. Use a mirror to check the back of your body or have someone else check for you. Don't forget to check for ticks on your children and your pets.
- **Take a shower** as soon as you can after being outdoors to wash off any ticks that may be on you.
- **Kill any ticks that might be on your clothing** by putting your clothes in a dryer on high heat for at least 10 minutes before washing them.

How to remove a tick

1. Use fine-tipped tweezers to grasp the tick as close to your skin as possible. Do not use your fingers.
2. Pull the tick straight out, gently but firmly. Don't squeeze the tick and don't jerk or twist the tweezers while pulling the tick out.
3. Once you remove the tick, wash the area with soap and water and then disinfect the area and your hands with rubbing alcohol or an iodine swab.
4. Put the tick in a secure container (for example, a bottle with a screw top) so it can't get out or be crushed and contact your local public health unit.

Do not use a lit match or cigarette, nail polish or nail polish remover, petroleum jelly, liquid soap or kerosene to remove the tick.

Dear Parents and Guardians:

With the arrival of warmer temperatures and more time spent outdoors, we wanted to remind you how to protect yourself and your loved ones from Blacklegged Ticks, which are native to our region, live in wooded areas, tall grasses and bushes, and may carry Lyme Disease.

In this regard, we encourage you to read the attached fact sheet from Health Ontario which indicates how to prevent tick bites when outdoors.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: KISS AND RIDE, SCHOOL PARKING AND SAFETY CONCERNS

Dear Parents and Guardians:

The safety of our students and staff is of paramount importance. Regrettably, we are seeing an increase in incidents related to traffic circulation at the front of the school, parking lots, and in the Kiss and Ride area, particularly during morning arrival and afternoon dismissal, that are putting students, staff, and other parents/guardians at risk. Vehicles entering the site in the wrong direction, parking and pulling out of no parking zones, parking in bus lanes, and driving at a high rate of speed, to name some of the incident types, are putting the safety of our children, staff, and other parents/guardians in jeopardy. We cannot wait for a serious injury, or worse to occur, before we correct this situation. Concurrent with the traffic safety concerns, we have seen increased aggression directed towards school staff when they attempt to direct vehicles to move from these restricted parking areas. This is not acceptable.

It is imperative that all parents and guardians driving their children to school adhere to the traffic circulation plan and comply with the onsite traffic and parking signage; It is equally imperative that **all drivers** follow the direction of staff managing the traffic circulation on the school site.

When using the Kiss and Ride, you must adhere to the following procedures:

- Be patient with other vehicles as they drop off students.
- Always drive slowly on school property.
- Pull up as close to the other vehicle in front to accommodate other parents/guardians.
- **Do not park or get out of your vehicle in this area, even if only for a few seconds.**
- Students are to exit the vehicle on the passenger side (right side).
- Once your child has left the vehicle, please exit right away.
- Please do not walk your children through the Kiss and Ride Lane; this can be unsafe.
- When pulling out to pass other stopped cars, proceed with caution.
