Bird Flu and Food Safety

To prevent bird (avian) flu, it is important to avoid contact with ill or deceased wild birds and animals. All poultry, beef and other meat, organs and eggs should be thoroughly cooked to kill all potential viruses, parasites and bacteria including bird flu, and all milk and milk products should be pasteurized before consumption.

The flu vaccine does not provide protection against the bird flu, but will provide protection against the seasonal flu. The seasonal flu virus can weaken your immune system and your ability to resist other infections.

Encouraging Active Play

Daily movement and active play are vital for children's physical, mental and emotional well-being. When kids develop basic movement skills like running, jumping, throwing and balancing, they build the confidence and ability to stay active for life!

Home plays an important role in encouraging these habits. Here are a few simple ways to support active lifestyles, allowing for more opportunities for children to move, explore and play.

- Encourage outdoor play by bringing children and their friends to parks or other natural settings.
- Take short walks or bike rides as a family.

- Play simple backyard games like tag, hopscotch or nature scavenger hunts.
- Limit screen time and make space for movement indoors. From 10 Lego games to get kids moving, to these 6 active games you can play with a pair of socks, there are lots of ways to have fun indoors if you're willing to be a little creative!

<u>Active for life</u> has fun, inclusive and practical ideas to keep kids moving and learning with free resources for families!

Ticks in Peel Region

Many types of ticks are found in Peel region, including black-legged ticks, which can cause Lyme disease and other diseases through their bite. However, the most common tick species encountered in Mississauga and Brampton is the American dog tick which does not transmit Lyme disease.

Blacklegged tick activity is influenced by temperature, and they may be active anytime temperatures are above freezing. American dog tick activity is influenced by day length and activity peaks in late May with activity decreasing as days shorten in the late summer and fall.

Avoid ticks by:

- Walking on paths and staying out of long grass or brushy areas.
- Using a bug spray with DEET or icaridin (always follow label directions).
- Wearing light-coloured clothing, so it's easier to see ticks; closed-toed shoes; long-sleeved shirts; long pants, tucked into your socks.
- After being outdoors, check for ticks on yourself, your children, and your pets.

If you have been bitten by a tick, remove and identify the tick.

• Use tweezers, grab the tick as close to the skin as possible.






Image Description: How to remove a Tick with tweezers

- Gently pull the tick straight out until the tick releases its hold on your skin. Avoid twisting, crushing or squeezing the tick.
- Use soap and water or an antiseptic to clean the tick bite and wash your hands.
- Submit photos of ticks for free identification and public health guidance to **etick.ca.** Store the tick in a container with a tight-fitting lid while waiting for tick identification results.

Important Update on the DPCDSB Dress Code Policy

March 4, 2025

The Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board (DPCDSB) remains committed to fostering a safe, caring, and inclusive learning environment where all students feel a sense of belonging and can achieve success. Dress codes and school uniforms are designed to support diversity, accessibility, safety, and the dignity of all students.

On January 28, 2025, the Board of Trustees approved updates to **Policy P-2006 Dress Code and School Uniform**. As part of these changes, dress code expectations now require that students ensure the area from the top of the shoulders to mid-thigh is covered.

Additionally, the DPCDSB dress code continues to prohibit any clothing with messages that contain or depict offensive or inappropriate content. Students are not permitted to wear attire that promotes:

- Hate
- Discrimination
- Illegal activity
- Profanity
- Violence
- Political language
- · Threats to health and safety
- Any content that violates the Ontario Human Rights Code

We appreciate your support in ensuring our schools remain welcoming and respectful spaces for all students.

Parish Summer Camps

Totus Tuus Toronto: Parish Summer Camps & Missionary Program

Day Camp:

- Mondays to Fridays
- Children entering Grades 1-6 in the fall

Students attend four classes each day, attend daily Mass, learn the Mass parts and liturgical songs, participate in games, icebreakers, skits, songs, recess, and prayer. The curriculum helps children to learn and be reinforced in important principles of their Catholic faith. College students who are on fire with their faith give the students living examples to observe and then imitate. Ticks & Lyme Disease

How to prevent tick bites when outdoors



Blacklegged ticks that may carry Lyme disease live in wooded areas, tall grasses and bushes. Protect yourself:

- Wear light-coloured clothing.
 It makes ticks easier to spot.
- Wear closed footwear and socks and a long sleeve shirt tucked into long pants. Tuck your pants into your socks.
- Use an insect repellent containing DEET or icaridin on clothes and exposed skin. Always be sure to follow the manufacturer's directions on how to use it.
- Check for ticks on your body, paying special attention to the groin area, belly button, armpits, head and behind ears and knees. Use a mirror to check the back of your body or have someone else check for you. Don't forget to check for ticks on your children and your pets.
- Take a shower as soon as you can after being outdoors to wash off any ticks that may be on you.
- Kill any ticks that might be on your clothing by putting your clothes in a dryer on high heat for at least 10 minutes before washing them.

How to remove a tick

- Use fine-tipped tweezers to grasp the tick as close to your skin as possible.
 Do not use your fingers.
- Pull the tick straight out, gently but firmly. Don't squeeze the tick and don't jerk or twist the tweezers while pulling the tick out.
- Once you remove the tick, wash the area with soap and water and then disinfect the area and your hands with rubbing alcohol or an iodine swab.
- Put the tick in a secure container (for example, a bottle with a screw top) so it can't get out or be crushed and contact your local public health unit.

Do not use a lit match or cigarette, nail polish or nail polish remover, petroleum jelly, liquid soap or kerosene to remove the tick.





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Dear Parents and Guardians:

With the arrival of warmer temperatures and more time spent outdoors, we wanted to remind you how to protect yourself and your loved ones from Blacklegged Ticks, which are native to our region, live in wooded areas, tall grasses and bushes, and may carry Lyme Disease.

In this regard, we encourage you to read the attached fact sheet from Health Ontario which indicates how to prevent tick bites when outdoors.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: KISS AND RIDE, SCHOOL PARKING AND SAFETY CONCERNS

Dear Parents and Guardians:

The safety of our students and staff is of paramount importance. Regrettably, we are seeing an increase in incidents related to traffic circulation at the front of the school, parking lots, and in the Kiss and Ride area, particularly during morning arrival and afternoon dismissal, that are putting students, staff, and other parents/guardians at risk. Vehicles entering the site in the wrong direction, parking and pulling out of no parking zones, parking in bus lanes, and driving at a high rate of speed, to name some of the incident types, are putting the safety of our children, staff, and other parents/guardians in jeopardy. We cannot wait for a serious injury, or worse to occur, before we correct this situation. Concurrent with the traffic safety concerns, we have seen increased aggression directed towards school staff when they attempt to direct vehicles to move from these restricted parking areas. This is not acceptable.

It is imperative that all parents and guardians driving their children to school adhere to the traffic circulation plan and comply with the onsite traffic and parking signage; It is equally imperative that **all drivers** follow the direction of staff managing the traffic circulation on the school site.

When using the Kiss and Ride, you must adhere to the following procedures:

- Be patient with other vehicles as they drop off students.
- Always drive slowly on school property.
- Pull up as close to the other vehicle in front to accommodate other parents/guardians.
- Do not park or get out of your vehicle in this area, even if only for a few seconds.
- Students are to exit the vehicle on the passenger side (right side).
- Once your child has left the vehicle, please exit right away.
- Please do not walk your children through the Kiss and Ride Lane; this can be unsafe.
- When pulling out to pass other stopped cars, proceed with caution.






