Allergy Alert

Christ the King CES is an "allergen aware school". There are pupils in attendance who suffer from severe and life-threatening allergies to certain foods, such as peanut and nut products and, in some cases, dairy, seafood, and eggs. Exposure to the smallest quantities can cause severe life-threatening reactions. We at Christ the King CES would appreciate the cooperation of the entire school community by NOT sending any lunches or snacks that could potentially harm a pupil or staff member. Please make sure that all of your children's caregivers are aware of the food restrictions within their classroom. Students should be reminded not to share food items. All food treats sent for sharing will be returned for home use.



Christ the King CES Hot Weather Plan for the 2024/25 School Year

- 1. Weather is monitored daily for heat advisories and when required, outdoor activities and recesses will be adjusted to limit the time outdoors (i.e. high UV index and/or Humidex +30°C may warrant modified recess periods).
- 2. Students will be advised to find **shaded areas** in the yard. Outdoor physical education classes will be reconsidered when temperature advisories are issued.
- 3. Students are encouraged to bring a **refillable water bottle** (labelled with their name) to school and to drink frequently throughout the day. We have a multiple refillable water stations as well as drinking fountains.
- 4. Our building is partially **air-conditioned.** The Amphitheatre is used as a cooling station for classes without air conditioning on a rotating basis.
- 5. Classroom lights will remain off and blinds drawn whenever possible.
- 6. Hats, sunglasses and sunscreen (SPF 15 minimum) are strongly recommended to protect students from the harmful rays of the sun. Please wear light-weight, light-colored, loose-fitting clothing that is appropriate for a Catholic school environment and in accordance with the DPCDSB Dress Code Policy. Safe, appropriate footwear is also encouraged, as flip-flops and sandals can be tripping hazards when participating in active play.
- 7. Students will be monitored for **signs and symptoms of heat-related illnesses** (e.g. heavy sweating; weakness; cold, pale and/or clammy skin; fainting; vomiting). First Aid treatment will be administered as required.

The following are the humidex guidelines from *Environment Canada*:

Less than 29 Celsius	No discomfort				
30 to 39 Celsius	Some discomfort				
40 to 45 Celsius	Great discomfort, avoid exertion				
Above 45 Celsius	Dangerous				
Above 54 Celsius	Heat stroke imminent

Dear Parents/Guardians:

End of the school year and graduation for senior students are events to be celebrated and enjoyed by students, families, and staff alike. Indeed, this is true for students, families, and staff in any grade. Unfortunately, this time of year can also prompt incidents of unsafe behaviour, acts of vandalism and "threats" characterized as "grad pranks" or "year-end pranks." We are asking for your help in ensuring that your child is aware that unsafe and unacceptable behaviours can have serious consequences. We do not condone:

- Bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, threat(s) or intimidation;
- Violence of any form;
- Verbal, physical, or sexual abuse;
- Discrimination in any form;
- Inhumane treatment of animals;
- Theft:
- Unsafe or dangerous activities;
- Vandalism:
- Possession or use of intoxicating or banned substances;
- Possession or use of weapons (or replica weapons).

Individuals involved in these types of activities may be subject to criminal charges and school consequences, including losing the privilege to attend extra-curricular events such as the graduation ceremony.

Our *Catholic Code of Conduct* clearly outlines our expectations for all students and we hope that this will provide some guidance for anyone contemplating such activity, which often has an impact on the entire school community.

Thank you for your attention to this important matter as we work together to ensure that our young people experience a safe and healthy conclusion to the 2024-2025 school year.

Important Update on the DPCDSB Dress Code Policy

March 4, 2025

The Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board (DPCDSB) remains committed to fostering a safe, caring, and inclusive learning environment where all students feel a sense of belonging and can achieve success. Dress codes and school uniforms are designed to support diversity, accessibility, safety, and the dignity of all students.

On January 28, 2025, the Board of Trustees approved updates to **Policy P-2006 Dress Code and School Uniform**. As part of these changes, dress code expectations now require that students ensure the area from the top of the shoulders to mid-thigh is covered.

Additionally, the DPCDSB dress code continues to prohibit any clothing with messages that contain or depict offensive or inappropriate content. Students are not permitted to wear attire that promotes:

- Hate
- Discrimination
- Illegal activity
- Profanity
- Violence
- Political language
- Threats to health and safety
- Any content that violates the Ontario Human Rights Code

We appreciate your support in ensuring our schools remain welcoming and respectful spaces for all students.

Parish Summer Camps

Totus Tuus Toronto: Parish Summer Camps & Missionary Program

Day Camp:

- Mondays to Fridays
- Children entering Grades 1-6 in the fall

Students attend four classes each day, attend daily Mass, learn the Mass parts and liturgical songs, participate in games, icebreakers, skits, songs, recess, and prayer. The curriculum helps children to learn and be reinforced in important principles of their Catholic faith. College students who are on fire with their faith give the students living examples to observe and then imitate. This process teaches them that being a witness to their faith in the world around them is a very realistic and worthwhile goal. Ticks & Lyme Disease

How to prevent tick bites when outdoors



Blacklegged ticks that may carry Lyme disease live in wooded areas, tall grasses and bushes. Protect yourself:

- Wear light-coloured clothing.
 It makes ticks easier to spot.
- Wear closed footwear and socks and a long sleeve shirt tucked into long pants. Tuck your pants into your socks.
- Use an insect repellent containing DEET or icaridin on clothes and exposed skin. Always be sure to follow the manufacturer's directions on how to use it.
- Check for ticks on your body, paying special attention to the groin area, belly button, armpits, head and behind ears and knees. Use a mirror to check the back of your body or have someone else check for you. Don't forget to check for ticks on your children and your pets.
- Take a shower as soon as you can after being outdoors to wash off any ticks that may be on you.
- Kill any ticks that might be on your clothing by putting your clothes in a dryer on high heat for at least 10 minutes before washing them.

How to remove a tick

- Use fine-tipped tweezers to grasp the tick as close to your skin as possible.
 Do not use your fingers.
- Pull the tick straight out, gently but firmly. Don't squeeze the tick and don't jerk or twist the tweezers while pulling the tick out.
- Once you remove the tick, wash the area with soap and water and then disinfect the area and your hands with rubbing alcohol or an iodine swab.
- Put the tick in a secure container (for example, a bottle with a screw top) so it can't get out or be crushed and contact your local public health unit.

Do not use a lit match or cigarette, nail polish or nail polish remover, petroleum jelly, liquid soap or kerosene to remove the tick.

With the arrival of warmer temperatures and more time spent outdoors, we wanted to remind you how to protect yourself and your loved ones from Blacklegged Ticks, which are native to our region, live in wooded areas, tall grasses and bushes, and may carry Lyme Disease.

In this regard, we encourage you to read the attached fact sheet from Health Ontario which indicates how to prevent tick bites when outdoors.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: KISS AND RIDE, SCHOOL PARKING AND SAFETY CONCERNS

Dear Parents and Guardians:

The safety of our students and staff is of paramount importance. Regrettably, we are seeing an increase in incidents related to traffic circulation at the front of the school, parking lots, and in the Kiss and Ride area, particularly during morning arrival and afternoon dismissal, that are putting students, staff, and other parents/guardians at risk. Vehicles entering the site in the wrong direction, parking and pulling out of no parking zones, parking in bus lanes, and driving at a high rate of speed, to name some of the incident types, are putting the safety of our children, staff, and other parents/guardians in jeopardy. We cannot wait for a serious injury, or worse to occur, before we correct this situation. Concurrent with the traffic safety concerns, we have seen increased aggression directed towards school staff when they attempt to direct vehicles to move from these restricted parking areas. This is not acceptable.

It is imperative that all parents and guardians driving their children to school adhere to the traffic circulation plan and comply with the onsite traffic and parking signage; It is equally imperative that **all drivers** follow the direction of staff managing the traffic circulation on the school site.

When using the Kiss and Ride, you must adhere to the following procedures:

- Be patient with other vehicles as they drop off students.
- Always drive slowly on school property.
- Pull up as close to the other vehicle in front to accommodate other parents/guardians.
- Do not park or get out of your vehicle in this area, even if only for a few seconds.
- Students are to exit the vehicle on the passenger side (right side).
- Once your child has left the vehicle, please exit right away.
- Please do not walk your children through the Kiss and Ride Lane; this can be unsafe.
- When pulling out to pass other stopped cars, proceed with caution.






